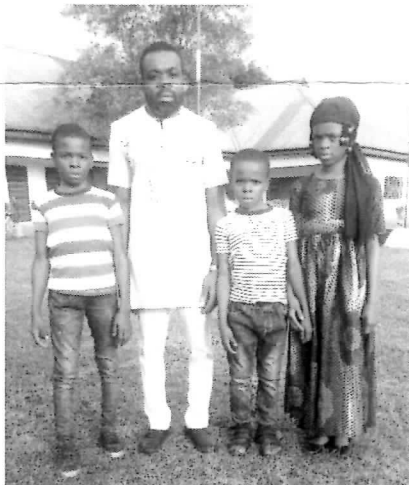


In fact, we project for the new school term starting in September 2020 to have **269 students** studying, with increases at both NCBC and WNCC. God is giving the increase because of you!

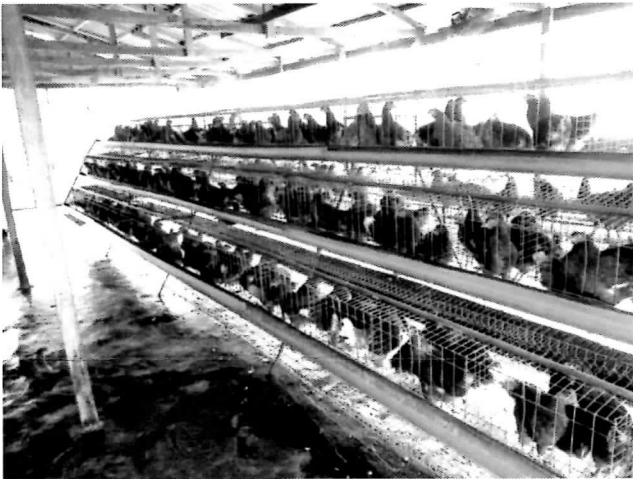
Renovations at NCBC

Through your partnership, we were able to put a new roof on one of our dormitories at the Nigerian Christian Bible College. The previous building was unusable as the roof leaked and was unsafe. However, because of your assistance, we were able to put a new roof on the dorm and we will be housing students there this September.



Vocational Skills at WNCC

Because of your continued partnership, we have been able to expand our vocational skills area of the school. We now are able to offer poultry programs, fish farming, computer skills and networking, and other agricultural programs which not only benefit the students at WNCC but provide much-needed revenue for the school.



Recently, the school launched a plantain program (plantain is similar to bananas). This program will benefit the school for many years to come.

We are also launching a virtual classroom at WNCC for students to learn online. This pilot program was born due to the COVID-19 pandemic but has proved to be an effective method of instruction.
