May and June were filled with ministries to the brim. At the beginning of May our congregation attended a meeting organized by Chernivtsi Church of Christ. They were so encouraged by the winter retreat for churches of Christ in Western Ukraine organized by our congregation (Lviv church of Christ) in January that they decided to make another event. I had an opportunity to teach Bible classes to the assembly and also lead a discussion of some relevant topics for the youth group.

Also in this month I was able to evangelize to one elderly lady (91 y.o.) who lives 60 km away from Lviv. Her relatives contacted me and asked to visit her and tell her more about biblical baptism. After the very first Bible study she decided to be baptized. That was a great thing. The Lviv congregation is the closest to her, so in June I visited her for the second time, and some church members went with me to meet with the lady and partake of the Lord's Suppers with her. I'm glad that other Christians of our congregation are growing in this kind of ministry.

At the end of May, brethren of our congregation went to the BVBIU graduation since two of the graduates (Bogdan and Maryana) entered the program from our congregation. Upon finishing their academic Bible studies, they made a decision to move to Kyiv and become a part of the local



congregation to support it in its ministries and to apply the knowledge that they acquired at the Bible institute. I'm grateful that God gives me opportunities to teach at this institute and raise the knowledge among the Christians in Ukraine whether they will become preachers upon graduation or not.



At the beginning of June I visited Kremenchug Church of Christ where our brother Arthur (initially baptized in Lviv congregation) is preaching. I had a great opportunity to meet with this congregation, to preach there, to teach various classes and to encourage Arthur for further ministry.

We had an increasing number of guests in the Lviv congregation over the past two months. And that's so great. The place that we rent is filled with people completely. Therefore, we started talking with the brethren that if the church keeps growing (and we are doing our best for that), we will need to start looking for a bigger place. However, we are grateful for



what we already have, and we hope that God will provide for our church family the best option possible.
